Background Information

People's Alliance for Credible Elections (PACE) is an independent, non-partisan, non-government domestic election observer group based in Yangon. PACE was founded in 2013 to strengthen democratic institutions in Myanmar through safeguarding citizen rights and promoting public participation in the electoral process. To promote transparency, accountability and inclusiveness in the electoral process, PACE will mainly be working on civic and voter education, election observation and electoral reform.

Upholding the principles enshrined in "Universal Declaration of Human Rights", PACE's work will be implemented regardless of race, religion and gender.

Moreover, PACE has signed "Declaration of Global Principles for "Nonpartisan Observation and Monitoring" by Citizen Organizations," which is a document endorsed by more than 260 organization from 75 countries.

Objectives of State/Regional Coordinator

Under the direction of the Networks Coordinator, the State/Regional Coordinators are responsible for supervising the PACE activities of Electoral Reform Process in respective States and Regions. State/Regional Coordinators are part time staffs and expected to work 2 to 3 days per week.



Task and Responsibilities

- 1. Supporting the PACE core team to implement the PACE's activities in respective State/Region;
- 2. Coordinate with PACE core team to recruit and manage the volunteers in respective State/Region;
- 3. Attending the trainings from PACE core team and other partner International NGOs if it is required to conduct the PACE's activities in respective State/Region;
- 4. Establishing and maintaining contact with local CSOs as well as electoral stakeholders;
- 5. Submitting the monthly activities report to the PACE's Networks Coordinator; Requirement Qualification

- Must be able to work at under the thigh deadline;
